What

The City of St. Louis Park will be adjusting speed limits on city streets. The city's default speed limit will be 20 miles per hour on local residential streets with higher speed limits on busier streets. Visit bit.ly/speedlimitsSLP for a map of streets where speed limits will change.

Why

Slower speed limits promote a mobility system that prioritizes walking first, then bicycling and transit, and then motor vehicle use. Lower traffic speeds reduce the likelihood of a crash and make all types of crashes less likely to lead to death or life-changing injury.

When

The city will begin updating speed limit signage throughout the city in November 2021 and should be complete by mid-December 2021.
