

Experience LIFE in the Park

Contractor has asked for permission to connect to the city sanitary sewer system for dewatering purposes during the construction process at the aforementioned address. The city will allow this connection under the following terms:

- 1. Contractor agrees to follow each and all of the dewatering specifications provided by the city.
- 2. Contractor will pay for any charges incurred by the city for the discharge of the dewatering operation. The rate is \$5,653.33 per million gallons of discharge. A final determination will be based on our costs from the Metropolitan Council.
- 3. Contractor is responsible for providing and maintaining a meter so an accurate determination of the flow can be measured. If at any time the meter is not working properly, Contractor must replace the meter, and the city will determine the amount of flow when the meter was not working properly.
- 4. Contractor is responsible for filtering discharge to the sanitary sewer prior to the meter to remove solids and to prevent the sewer system from clogging.
- 5. Contractor will provide a list of at least two emergency contacts available 24 hours a day and will train two city staff on shutting the pumps off in case of an emergency.
- 6. Contractor is responsible for any damage caused by the additional flow entering the sanitary sewer system, if GPM is negligently increased above and beyond the city's allowable pumping rate.
- 7. The city reserves the right to require the pumps to be turned off or throttled down at any time so as not to overwhelm our system, such as severe weather due to inflow and infiltration (I/I) concerns.
- 8. Contractor will submit monthly discharge report for monthly billing.
- 9. In the event of non-payment, the City of St. Louis Park has the right to certify any unpaid amount to the property taxes of the aforementioned property owner, per Minnesota state statute. Further, the contractor and property owner waive their right to appeal this unpaid amount at a public hearing conducted by the city council.
- 10. The undersigned acknowledges that this application has been read and that the above is correct and agrees to comply with all the ordinances and laws of the City of St. Louis Park regulating erosion control and stormwater management. The applicant certifies that erosion control measures will be in place before land disturbance occurs on the property.
