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Temporary signs are regulated in Section 36-362 of the city code

The regulations are summarized below.

- 1. With the exception of pedestrian signs as defined below, temporary signs may be permitted on a lot for a total of 30 days in any calendar year.
- 2. The total sign area of all temporary signs on a lot should not exceed 80 square feet.
- 3. A temporary sign should not direct persons to or advertise a product or service not available on the premises where the sign is located. Signs must be located on the property where the service/product is available and cannot be placed in the public right of way.
- 4. Temporary signs, other than pedestrian signs, may be constructed of paper, cloth, canvas, wood or any other light and non-durable material.
- 5. Pedestrian signs are temporary signs and are further regulated as follows:
 - a. Pedestrian signs may be displayed in the C, O and MX districts only.
 - b. No portion of the sign should project beyond a cube measuring 3 feet wide by 3 feet deep by 4 feet in height.
 - c. Pedestrian signs may be placed up to the property line, subject to Section 36-76. No portion of the sign should be placed in or project into the public right of way, and any such sign should be located so that it does not obstruct pedestrian or vehicular movement or impede pedestrian or vehicular visibility.
 - d. The sign may be displayed during business hours only. The sign should be stored inside a building during non-business hours and during severe weather conditions.
 - e. The sign should not be placed in a manner that it obstructs the visibility of another property's permanent signage.
 - f. No place of business should display more than one pedestrian sign at any time, and the total of all pedestrian and other temporary signs on the property should not exceed the total allowed in table 36-362A.
 - g. Pedestrian signs that are maintained in good repair and in accordance with all ordinance provisions may be permitted for up to one calendar year. The zoning administrator may revoke a permit and remove any sign that does not meet the ordinance requirements or is creating a public hazard. After one year, a new permit may be applied for.
 - h. Pedestrian signs may be constructed of wood, metal, non-flexible plastic or any other durable material.
